- 1. Agreement To Follow Directions. I agree to observe and obey all posted rules and warnings, and further agree to follow any oral instructions or directions given by Non-profit Construction Corporation, or the employees, representatives, or agents of Non-profit Construction Corporation. I agree to wear Personal Protective Equipment at all times while in Volunteer service such as but not limited to PROTECTIVE EYE COVERS AND SAFTEY GLASSES, SAFTEY GLOVES, EAR PLUGS, HARD HATS, HIGH VISIBILITY CLOTHING AND REFLECTIVE WEAR, STEEL TOE BOOTS DUST MASKS AND CRAWL SUITS.
- **2. Assumption of the Risks and Release.** I recognize that there are certain inherent risks associated with the above-described activity and I assume full responsibility for personal injury to myself and (if applicable) my family members, and further release and discharge Non-profit Construction Corporation for injury, loss, or damage arising out of my or my family's use of or presence upon the facilities of Non-profit Construction Corporation AND PRIVATE PROPERTY OWNERS, whether caused by the fault of myself, my family, Non-profit Construction Corporation or other third parties.
- **3. - **4. Fees.** I agree to pay for all damages to the facilities of Non-profit Construction Corporation caused by any negligent, reckless, or willful actions by me or my family.
- **5. Applicable Law.** Any legal or equitable claim that may arise from participation in the above shall be resolved under California law.
- **6.** No **Duress.** I agree and acknowledge that I am under no pressure or duress to sign this agreement and that I have been given a reasonable opportunity to review it before signing. I further agree and acknowledge that I am free to have my own legal counsel review this agreement if I so desire. I further agree and acknowledge that Non-profit Construction Corporation has offered to refund any fees I have paid to use its facilities if I choose not to sign this agreement.
- **7. Arm's Length Agreement.** This agreement and each of its terms are the product of an arm's length negotiation between the Parties. In the event any ambiguity is found to exist in the interpretation of this agreement or any of its provisions, the Parties, and each of them, explicitly reject the application of any legal or equitable rule of interpretation which would lead to a construction either "for" or "against" a particular party based upon their status as the drafter of a specific term, language, or provision giving rise to such ambiguity. Accordingly, the Parties specifically reject the application of Cal. Civ. Code §1654 to this agreement, as well as any other statute or common law principles of similar effect.
